




Our Mission is Simple: To Strengthen our Communities

We bring together leadership and funding to engage the community by coordinating local change efforts, engaging citizens, and bringing diverse voices and views together to address current and emerging needs.


We strengthen our communities through collaboration and partnership with donors and others to ensure lasting impact and to improve the quality of life for perpetuity.

Philanthropy 101

Philanthropy, estate plans, and planned giving. These concepts hold great meaning for us here at the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation. In the past few years, and we anticipate for some time to come, we are witnessing a collective transfer of wealth from our donors, and from folks we haven't yet met.

However, as one of our supportive attorneys recently stated "Wealth is a relative term and is directly related to each individual's situation. To one person, a sizeable gift to a charity is \$10,000. To another, it may be a gift of \$1,000,000. Charitable giving is not exclusive to wealthy individuals, but more importantly an opportunity for every person, and any time, in any place, to do good."

"Imagine if everyone simply gave 1% of their total estate to charity? It is conceivable that we could fund everything that needed funding after," states Karlene Grabner, Director of Donor Services. "Before our primary responsibility in working with donors is to always honor their wishes and help them achieve their goal of doing good."

Many of our donors are surprised to learn when you work with our staff in establishing a gift to be received from your estate, there are specific perimeters we adhere to including:

- We will not share or sell your contact information. With anyone.
- We will not contact you unless we believe there is relevant information you may need about your charitable plans.
- We allow for adaptability in your plans with the understanding circumstances may change either for you, or one of the organizations you wish to gift.

In addition, our services include assisting our donors in researching and vetting organizations you may wish to support. Your gifts can go to multiple organizations, in or out of state.

On occasion, we also work with donors in creative ways in which to fund their plans. There are often numerous assets to consider, such as life insurance, precious collections, or real estate, all of which can be woven into an estate plan by a donor in order to reach their charitable goals.


Trust, wills, and beneficiaries. If these words and concepts seem daunting, they needn't be. In fact, quite the contrary is true. They should help ease your mind. To explore these options and establish a solid estate plan is one way to ensure that whatever you leave behind is what you want.

Two local attorneys were called upon to provide some insight into the process, and how easily philanthropy can be incorporated into the planning process. According to Nate Olson, a simple question often starts the process; "Where is it all going to go in the end?" Then, if a client doesn't have an answer, he often broaches the topic of philanthropy and works with the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation to explore options.

Nate sits on the OACF board of trustees, but even before joining the board, he and his peer, Attorney Julie Maslowski both indicated they routinely ask about charitable giving during the estate planning process. Julie notes, "When my clients take the time to sit down with the OACF, they become more invested in the process of charitable giving. It's gratifying to watch. Many are not aware of opportunities such as 'donor-advised funds' that allow them to create easy, tax efficient, and low-cost gifts." Nate agreed, stating, "The Foundation staff is wonderful to work with and very helpful in identifying areas of interest to a client, or specific charities." He also noted giving only to specific charities can sometimes become difficult, and it is often a better idea to focus on an area of interest, and entrust the decision to the Foundation staff. This can be especially true, as charitable organizations can change over time.



One of the goals for Nate and Julie in the planning process is to keep an estate plan relatively simple. One way to do this is to establish a trust, with yourself as the primary trustee while you are living, and select a secondary trustee, for when you pass. That way, if you choose, you can still benefit from your assets. All of your assets can go into a trust, and from there, upon your death, be distributed as you have indicated. Making sure your beneficiaries are appropriately identified, or establishing a trust, can help avoid the probate process when it comes time to execute your plans. In the ideal situation, Nate suggests getting your team together, including your financial advisor, your accountant, and your attorney to assist you in the planning process and have everyone working on it together.



Both attorneys agree the result of not planning can come at a high cost. For high-net-worth families, federal estate tax liability (at a rate of 40% of the overall net worth) can greatly impact the value of the estate. With proper planning during your lifetime, this tax liability can be avoided altogether through the use of charitable gifts either during life or upon death. It comes down to the very simple choice of leaving part of your wealth and estate to the government or to a charity of your choosing.

Like one of the first questions Nate asks, we invite you to ask yourself, "What will your legacy be?" If there is a cause or charitable program you are passionate about, the time to think about it is now. Advanced planning can give you peace of mind, knowing your affairs are in order. Proper planning will also help minimize confusion and potential conflict regarding the distribution of your assets.

Planning to Leave a Legacy

Once you've looked at your estate plans, and realized you've taken care of your family and your other obligations, you may want to think about what you can do to make a difference and establish a legacy.

For one couple, Dave and Denise, the decision was a fairly easy one and they began conversations with the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation staff. The couple represents perfectly that philanthropists come in all ages and demographics. Both are hard-working, have had long careers in their chosen fields, and have also been the beneficiaries themselves of estates when dear relatives passed away. With no children of their own, they found themselves in a position of trying to determine what else they might do with the money and the estate they would leave behind.

They wanted to leave their estate somewhere that would make a difference. Denise knew of the Foundation and felt that working with it was a logical choice. They began having conversations with Foundation staff five years ago. They feel good about their plans, having set aside some of their estate for family and also ensuring that if one passes before the other, the remaining spouse will be well provided for.

One of the goals they had was to be able to diversify where their estate went without it being too complicated. Denise noted that working with the Community Foundation offered one-stop shopping. They worked with the Director of Donor Services, Karlene Grabner, and with her guidance identified 15 organizations or areas of interest they wished to give to. Karlene began her work of vetting and ensuring gift recipients would be good choices, with clear missions stated

by the organizations. Upon the deaths of both of them, the Community Foundation will disperse the funds. In the event one or more organizations cease to exist, or other issues arise, there is a secondary plan, which allows for a higher percent distribution to the remaining organizations.

They found the process of working with the Foundation straightforward, as they had already discussed their desires and plans with their trusted financial advisor of 30 years. They are very confident that their giving plans will remain confidential, and will be well carried out by the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation.


Legacy in Action

Richard and Margaret Osborn were educators, both born in states other than Wisconsin. Richard was a professor at UW Oshkosh for many years, teaching art classes. Margaret worked in the Oshkosh public school system.

When they passed away, unbeknownst to many of the charities which received gifts, they left a sizeable estate. With no children of their own, they chose to quietly work with a local bank to establish a trust in order to carry out their wishes.

Richard passed away in 2009 and Margaret, more recently, in July 2021. The impact of their gift is felt throughout the community and beyond, as they chose 16 organizations to receive gifts from their estate, the majority of which were located in the Oshkosh area. In a nod to their past, they also left a gift to the School of the Art Institute of Chicago, where Richard achieved his Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree.

The Oshkosh Public Museum received part of the bequest and an endowment fund was established at the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation. Sarah Phillips, the museum director, was pleasantly surprised to learn of the gift to the museum's endowment fund, held at the Foundation. She states, "I got goosebumps at that moment and I was thinking to myself, oh my goodness, someone is noticing our work!" The impact on their endowment fund will be felt for years to come, as it will allow museum staff to explore additional exhibits or new programming to reach visitors with educational outreach projects. She went on to say, "Bequests can be a gamechanger. When we receive a gift like this, it will always be used for a traveling exhibition, to co-fund a large permanent exhibition, or to expand our educational programs, especially for school-age children. Our goal is to take a proactive and responsive approach and create our programs to honor all the people who have come before us, both indigenous and European settlers of Oshkosh. We see this as a continuation of the Sawver leagey, by delivering meaningful experiences to benefit the public. We are grateful the Osborns thought of the Oshkosh Public Museum in their estate plan."
